I obtained MBBS degree under University of Dhaka in the year 1980 and joined the national health services under Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Govt. of peoples republic of Bangladesh in 1981.

I obtained Masters in Primary Healthcare Management (MPHM) from Mahidol University, Thailand under a WHO fellowship program in the year 1994.

I was appointed to work as WHO focal point in the Directorate of Health Services. I was involved in the formulation of WHO country programs and coordination of its implementation and management.

I have experiences in developing WHO Inter-Country Program (ICP) in SEARO in New Delhi in 2003.

I was actively involved in the formulation of WHO Country Cooperation Strategy (CCS) for Bangladesh in 2006.

I retired from the Govt. assignment few months back and affiliated to work full time with Liver Foundation Bangladesh for its awareness and prevention programme of hepatitis B & C.

I was first detected HBV chronic hepatitis in 1997 and later developed features of End Stage Liver Disease in the year 2005. I underwent Living Donor Liver Transplantation (LDLT) at Indraprastha Apollo Hospital, New Delhi, India in September 2006. At present, I am leading a normal active life.
